More VA News

Two employees at a VA hospital in North Carolina have been placed on administrative leave for allegedly engaging in "inappropriate scheduling practices" after an employee in Wyoming was suspended over similar charges last week.

The Department of Veterans Affairs said in a statement the alleged misconduct at the Durham VA Medical Center came to light after Veterans Affairs Secretary Eric K. Shinseki ordered an audit of scheduling practices. The employees in question engaged in the alleged misconduct at some point between 2009 and 2012, the statement said. The VA said it will further investigate to determine if the allegations are true.

"VA takes any allegations about patient care or employee misconduct very seriously," the statement read. "If the allegations are true, the inappropriate behavior is unacceptable and employees will be held accountable." The statement comes less than a week after the department announced an employee at a VA medical center in Cheyenne had been suspended also for allegedly engaging in improper scheduling practices.

An email obtained by Fox News Friday revealed the employee instructed his workers to manipulate records to make it seem like patients were being seen within the agency's required 14-day window, which he described as "gaming the system."

The falsification of records is only one of the scandals engulfing the VA. The American Legion and some in Congress have called for Shinseki's ouster following allegations of 40 patient deaths at the Phoenix VA hospital due to delays in care, and of a secret list the hospital kept of patients waiting for appointments to hide the delays.

The White House has voiced support for Shinseki and he has brushed off calls to resign.

Lawyers4Vets - Monthly Pro Bono Veterans Legal Clinic

Introduction: As a service to area Veterans, the South Carolina Appleseed Legal Justice Center has partnered with the Wm. Jennings Bryan Dorn VA Medical Center and members of the private bar to establish Lawyers 4 Vets, a Pro Bono Veterans Legal Clinic.

Purpose:

Lawyers 4 Vets connects low income and homeless Veterans with attorneys who provide legal advice and representation on certain issues.

Legal Issues and Services: The clinic will ONLY address the following topics:

- Obtaining identification (Social Security, South Carolina State ID, birth certificates)
- Child support and visitation issues (in South Carolina)
- Expungements and pardons (for convictions from South Carolina courts)
- Consumer protection
- Simple wills and healthcare power of attorney

Eligibility:

Veterans will be screened for eligibility, and if eligible will be given an appointment at the clinic. Lawyers 4 Vets will assist eligible Veterans regardless of military discharge status.

Appointments: Veterans who would like to be screened for eligibility should call the number listed below and leave a message including their name, phone number, and legal issue. The Veteran will be contacted within 2 business days by an intake volunteer who will ask the veteran a number of questions to determine if they are eligible. If the Veteran is eligible and has a qualifying legal issue, they will be given the next available appointment at the legal clinic. Appointments are required for a Veteran to receive a face-to-face meeting with a lawyer. Walk-ins will not be seen and will be directed to contact the telephone intake.

Defensive Driving Course

Rehab Services will be offering an eight-hour Defensive Driving course to all eligible veterans on 5/30/14 at the Dorn VA Medical Center in Columbia. The course may be good for a four-point reduction from one's driver record. The course will last from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and there is **NO CHARGE** for the course. (Similar courses in the community range in cost from \$55-\$85). To be eligible the veteran must be enrolled at the Dorn VA Medical Center. If the enrollment is at the Charleston VA Medical Center, the veteran should contact Alan Simmerson, RKT, at 803-776-4000, ext. 7052. The veterans must also be in possession of a valid South Carolina driver's license. Some car insurance companies allow for a 5-10% decrease in premiums if the insured has completed this course.

Home Depot News

The Home Depot Foundation added \$3.9 million in grants to organizations across the country that address veterans' housing needs. The recent round of grants brings the Foundation's financial contributions to the issue of \$65.7 million since launching its mission in the spring of 2011 of ensuring every veteran has a safe place to call home. To date, donations made by The Home Depot Foundation have impacted more than 10,200 units of veterans' housing. Some of the project funding included:

- \$1.7 million to nonprofits to repair or construct 323 units of permanent supportive housing for veterans, including 225 units that serve veterans with families.
- \$800,000 to nonprofits that will provide transitional housing to 131 homeless veterans.
- \$400,000 to a nonprofit organization that offers 58 women veterans and their families a permanent supportive housing solution.
- \$875,000 to provide critical home repairs and maintenance to 126 single-family homes owned by veterans and their families.
