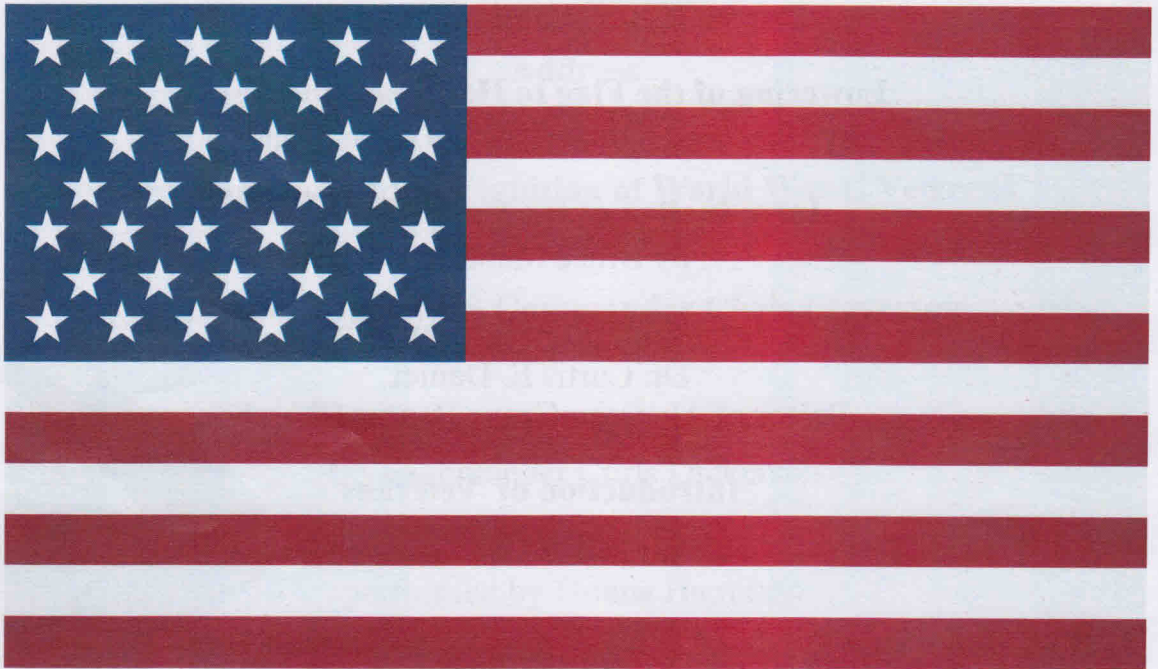

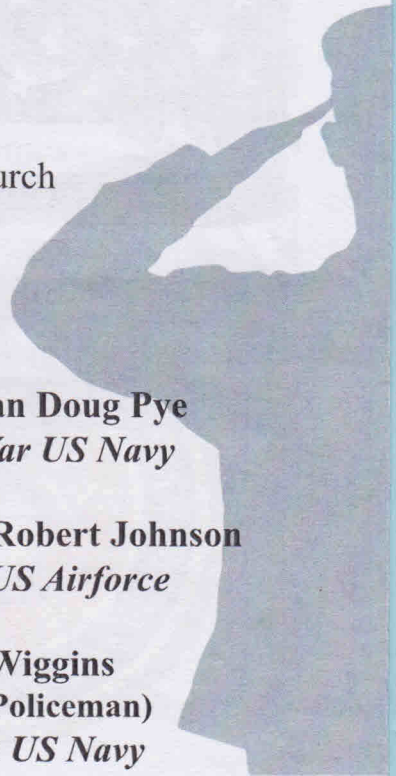

Our Guest Speaker Commander Chris Dickerson

Commander Dickerson is the current Commanding Officer of Naval Recruiting District Raleigh. He is responsible for all of the Navy's Recruiting efforts in North and South Carolina as well as a portion of Georgia.

Originally from a small town called Scio, located in the eastern portion of Ohio, he enlisted in the Navy in 1991. After completing nuclear power training as an electronics technician, he was selected for the Nuclear Enlisted Commissioning Program.

He was served in multiple capacities both ashore and afloat during his 24 year career. His most recent sea tour was as the Executive Officer onboard the USS DE WERT (FFG45).
